Featured Farm

This issue's featured operation is the feed mill. Last year the College hired a new feed mill supervisor, Josh Franks: who took over for long time supervisor Herb Keith when he retired in May of 2010. The mill presently makes an average of 10 to 15 tons of feed per week. The farms that require the most feed are the hog farm and the dairy. The hog farm receives three different types of feed rations and the dairy receives four. Josh said the major expenses for the feed mill are corn and soybean meal respectively. All of the rations the mill produces use at least one of these ingredients, and some use both. Josh, along with typically 5 students that are assigned to the mill, makes all the feed. Josh says the hardest part of supervising the mill is student scheduling. He has to make a schedule to work effectively with the students' class schedules so they get their 15 hours, but he also has to make sure someone is available to deliver feed to the farms. "My favorite part of the job is letting the students "take control" of all the tasks at hand. I love showing up and finding a clean mill with all the feed made, and delivered, or an effective plan of action to accomplish the task. They usually do a good job of this and it makes me proud."
