Born June 18, 1902, in Swan, MO, Douglas was the first son of Ozark pioneers, Mary Elizabeth and Charles Preston Mahnkey. He passed away at the Forsyth Nursing and Rehab Center on November 2, 2004.

Doug spent his youth in Kirbyville, Mincy, and Hollister, and attended high school in Forsyth and The School of the Ozarks. While still a teenager, he qualified to become a school teacher by attending Southwest Missouri State Teachers College, and taught for several years at Bee Creek School near Kirbyville. In 1928, he married Merie Walker and later had three children.

After completing a correspondence course from La Salle Correspondence School in Chicago, he was the last person to pass the Missouri Bar Exam without attending formal law school. For over 60 years, Doug practiced law throughout the State of Missouri. He was elected County Clerk in Taney County in 1926, in which capacity he served until his election to the Missouri House of Representatives in 1934. He left

after one term to serve one term as Taney County Prosecuting Attorney, 1937-1939. In 1945, he returned to the Missouri House, where he served three more terms. After leaving the legislature for the final time, he maintained a private law office in Forsyth and Branson until 1997. One of the highlights of Doug's term in the state legislature was meeting President Truman in Fulton, MO, for the famous Iron Curtain Speech in 1945. In the late 1940s and early 50s, Doug played an instrumental role in moving the town of Old Forsyth from its original location, which became a flood area due to the construction of

Bull Shoals Dam, to its present location. In the 1950s, the Mahnkey family built and owned a motel in Forsyth to cater to the growing tourist industry. Doug also served as the City Attorney of Forsyth.

In later years, Doug became a noted local and re-

gional historian. He published two books, "Bright Glowed My Hills," and "Hill and Holler Stories," and wrote extensively about the Ozarks and its native people. His work appeared in the "Ozark Mountaineer" magazine over several decades. He was a renowned storyteller and was known as one of the last "Old Time Storytellers." An avid hunter and fisherman, Doug enjoyed the outdoors and always had a prolific vegetable garden. He spent many hours on the rivers and streams fishing, camping, and floating with his family. A lifelong Cardinals fan, he spent many summers coaching Little League baseball. Douglas is survived by one son, William "Bill" Mahnkey of Forsyth; one daughter, Mary Jo Kirkey and husband Richard of Rogersville; grandchildren William Douglas Mahnkey and wife Meredith of Springfield, Elizabeth Turner '99 and husband Grant '99 of Forsyth. Matthew Kirkey and wife Debbie of Ozark, and Julie Fox of Springfield; great-grandchildren Tyler, Trevor, Christopher, and Margaret.

Doug and his family were honored by the College at the Family Values Convocation featuring former Vice-President Dan Quayle in October 1994, as one of the founding families of the Ozarks.
