The year 2006 is well underway and SAA members are excited about jumping into all the projects that we have in store for this semester. Homecoming was one of the main events during the fall semester, and it turned out to be very successful. SAA members put together a beautiful banner that thanked alumni for helping to restore the Chapel. Members also assisted alumni with the Homecoming Memorial Service and at the alumni banquet on Saturday evening.

SAA was busy with several other activities during the fall semester. We participated in the National Make-A-Difference Day by collecting 48 books to donate to the local Boys and Girls Club. Also, members participated in the campus blood drive for the American Red Cross and rang the bells for the Salvation Army during the Christmas season. SAA, along with housing, held our annual Dollar Drive for the Salvation Army and collected a total of \$2,388.59, which went to the victims of Hurricane Katrina. In the past five years SAA has collected almost \$4,400

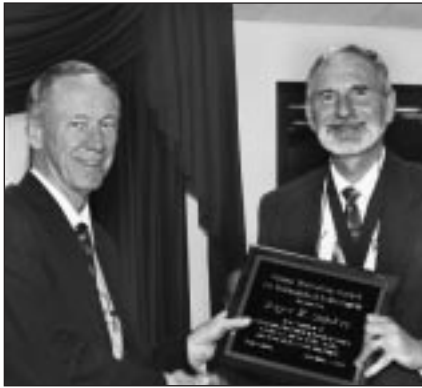

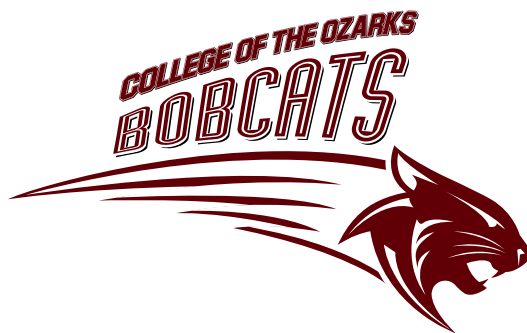

Sports News

At press time the Bobcats stood at 20-5, at one stretch during the season winning fifteen games in a row, and were ranked #6 nationally in NAIA Division II. Three of those losses came to NAIA Division I teams, and one came at the hands of NCAA Division II Southwest Baptist University in double overtime. On January 28 and 29 C of O picked up two huge wins over conference rivals Bellevue University and York College. The Bobcats stand at 11-1 in conference play and hold a one game lead in the conference race. C of O has been led this season by outstanding juniors, Michael Bonaparte and Heath Sitton. Bonaparte leads the conference in both scoring (21.9 ppg) and rebounding (8.6 rpg). Sitton has added 19.2 ppg as the two have formed a formidable scoring combination. College of the Ozarks will once again play host to the NAIA

National Tournament March 8-14. With the talent and cohesion present on this year's team, the Bobcats are in position to make some noise in the tournament.

The Lady Bobcats have had an amazing season to date as well. They stand at 25-1 overall and 12-0 in conference play. Their lone loss on the season came at the hands of NAIA Division I Concordia University (CA). At press time the Lady Bobcats had climbed to #3 in the NAIA Division II national rankings. Senior All-American Cara Painter leads the Lady Cats in scoring (19.6 ppg), rebounding (10.3 rpg), and is second in the nation in blocked shots with 3.3 per game. Sophomore guard Janessa DeMuth has elevated her game this season to become the second leading scorer (14.5 ppg) on the team, and



leads the conference in steals with 3.1 per game. At press time C of O had secured the regular season conference crown after two convincing wins over rival College of Saint Mary, who is the #20 team in the nation. The Lady Bobcats will host the conference tournament February 24-25, and will be shooting for another conference tournament championship and another trip to Sioux City, Iowa for the Women's NAIA Division II National Tournament where they lost to eventual champion Cedarville last year in the quarterfinals.

Hall of Fame



Aaron Dalton '01 and Seychelle Bruton Mahoney '00 are C of O's 2006 inductees to the Sports Hall of Fame.

Aaron was a four-year basketball letterman from 1996 to 2000. After earning Honorable Mention All-Conference his sophomore year, he became First Team his junior year and conference "MVP" his senior year. He was named an NAIA All-American Scholar Athlete his junior year when he helped lead the Cats to a runner-up position in the national tournament. He was also named to the All-Tournament team that year. Aaron ended his career with 1745 points, 606 rebounds, and a school record of 443 free throws made. His number (40) was retired after the 1999-2000 season.

Seychelle was a four-year letter winner from 1995-1999 for the Lady Cat basketball team that won the MCAC Conference Championship all four years she played. When she graduated, she was the all-time assist leader with 447 career assists and fifth all-time leading scorer with 1386 career points. She was named First Team All-Conference her sophomore, junior, and senior years and an Honorable Mention Kodak All-American her final two years.
