## Presidents' Messages

Greetings,

Thank you for this opportunity to be president of the College of the Ozarks Alumni Association. I consider

this an honor and a privilege. Let me introduce myself. I am one of three in my family to attend The School of Ozarks Junior College. I was just beginning at S of O at the same time my brothers, Carl and Don Johnson, were graduating in May of 1960. Upon my arrival, I was much more interested in girls and work, and less interested in academics. Thankfully, however, dedicated teachers such as Dr. Beulah Winfrey spent much time with me and got me on track. For



my student job assignment at the College, I worked with heavy equipment and was able to help dig the footings for the Atha Swimming Pool and the Lyons Memorial Library. Since that time, the campus landscape has changed. As a full-time professor of agriculture at the College for almost 37 years, I have had the opportunity to see the campus flourish and young people come to the campus with nothing and leave with a mountain of knowledge and an understanding of what it is to work.

Students are still required to attend chapel, as they did when I attended. I can still recall one of the most memorable services led by Dr. R. M. Good. He told of a story of Mr. J. C. Penney. As a child, Mr. Penney wanted a whistle for Christmas. He worked in a hardware store after school for several days and was eventually paid 25 cents for his work. He happily took his quarter in order to buy himself a new whistle. The first store he came to had a whistle for exactly 25 cents,

and he bought it. The next store he came to had the same whistle for only five cents. Dr. Good said the moral of the story is not to spend too much for your whistle!

Most of us have a limited income, but most of the time we are fortunate to have more than enough for the necessities of life. Unlike the young Mr. Penney, we need to be good stewards of our income. I believe one of the best ways you can demonstrate good stewardship is by investing in the education of students at College of the Ozarks. Perhaps they, too, will have a lasting memory of their time at C of O.

At the end of last year, we were almost halfway to our goal of \$250,000 for our current alumni project, the Admissions Office Renovation and Addition. If you haven't given to this project, I trust you will consider giving a gift soon. I wish you the best for 2009.



## *Alumnus Returns to Restore Chapel Windows*

Mr. Randy Carter, class of 1978, has begun the final phase of the Williams Memorial Chapel restoration project; he is working on restoring the magnificent stained glass windows. Built in 1956, Williams Memorial Chapel is decorated with beautiful stained glass masterpieces imported from Austria. Around the sanctuary, each window contributes an image that depicts the Bible, from Genesis through Revelation. There are 25 stained glass windows. Dr. Clark once told a story of how the windows were responsible for changing one student's eternal destiny. They have certainly affected the occupational destiny of another, Mr. Randy Carter.

Carter transferred to the School as an art student. Up until this point, his primary focus had been sculpting. During his first year there, The School of the Ozarks received the complete inventory of a stained glass company in St. Joseph, Missouri. He remembers spending his entire first semester unloading the studio from semi-trucks. Carter became one of the first stained glass students in the Art Department at S of O. "I had never really seen stained glass windows before coming to the College. They inspired me," he said. After learning the basics of stained glass, Carter went to the East Coast to develop his skill. He spent a month under the wing of Albinas Elksas, a glass painter from Lithuania, at Cummings Studios in North Adams, Massachusetts. Cummings is the leading studio in restoration and new work in the United States. After a month, Carter was hired by Cummings Studios to work full-time. One month eventually turned into over 20 years of employment there.

During his tenure at Cummings Studios, Carter restored many prominent stained glass windows, including windows that are part of the Library of Congress Dome, the Smithsonian, the White House, and in Memorial Hall at Harvard University (the largest 19th century glasswork in the United States). He has restored windows valued at over a million dollars each. In addition to his successful

restoration projects, Carter learned paintwork and figurative work from some of the top 20 painters in the United States.


After leaving Cummings in 1999, he returned home to Lebanon, Missouri. Carter has since earned his Master's in Art Education, taught classes at Missouri State University and Ozark Technical College, and has opened his own glass studio. It is at his studio in Lebanon that Carter has been working on the Chapel windows.

The process of restoration is meticulous and involved. Carter says that it takes an appreciation for the past in order to enjoy this type of work.

The window must first be removed and transported to his studio. There, a rubbing, or drawing, of the window is taken. After this, the window is dismantled and cleaned. Broken pieces are repaired, not replaced, and then re-glazed. After that, the window is reassembled using all new lead, and the window undergoes a process called waterproofing. Finally, the windows are reinstalled at their original location.


Currently, he is working on the smaller, less elaborate windows at the entrance of the chapel. The entire project is estimated to take five years. Carter said that he feels a sense of completeness, returning to the institution that introduced him to his life's passion. As he works on campus, memories from his college days return to him. He remembers being a volunteer fireman,

putting out a fire on the third floor of the science building and going to calls off campus. Carter also remembers friends and times spent with them. Most importantly, he remembers learning and working at the College. His work here provided the foundation for a successful career. Carter hopes that possibly through this project, some students on campus can learn technical skills in restoration and maybe even inspire careers in glass. For students, the windows have shed a full and colorful light on worshipping for many years. Now, the restoration of those windows may also shed light into some of their futures.


