Dear Alumnus,

Abraham Lincoln once said that “the best thing about the future is that it comes one day at a time.” During the past several months, the College of the Ozarks family has enjoyed each day and the many historic firsts that they held. In August, the new college preparatory lab school for grades 9-12, School of the Ozarks (S of O), opened its doors to students.



S of O, which continues the institution’s original namesake, also mirrors the institution’s founding mission: *to provide advantages of a Christian education for youth of both sexes, especially those found worthy, but who are without sufficient means to procure such training.* As such, S of O students do not pay tuition. Instead, they invest a little sweat equity into their education by cleaning their classrooms and lunchroom. While the name and mission are not new, students are experiencing new opportunities and many firsts.

The high school students experienced many firsts: their first school day, Founders Friday, a field trip, picture day, and semester finals. The cross country, volleyball, and basketball teams all experienced their first wins and losses. The lab school, like the College, is “focused on opportunity,” so it was appropriate that this year’s Homecoming theme reflected that. Alumni who participated in the Homecoming festivities were able to tour the new S of O facilities and visit with current S of O students.

November 8, arguably held one of the most historic events for the institution, the dedication of School of the Ozarks and the Roy F. Hopper Patriots Plaza. In attendance for the dedication was former First Lady Laura Bush who graciously participated in the ceremony prior to speaking at the Leonard B. and Edith Gittinger Community Convocation, themed “Education Matters.” During the dedication, alumni Roy F. Hopper, Lieutenant General Terrence R. Dake, Major General Gary Hughey, General Jerry Ragsdale, and Lillian Bell, wife of the late Brigadier General Tommy Bell, were present to unveil (with the help of the former First Lady) bronze plaques that

have become a permanent part of the Roy F. Hopper Patriots Plaza. After the dedication, Mrs. Bush took time to shake the hand of every S of O student. Later that day, College of the Ozarks students and S of O students alike, joined faculty, staff, and community members to hear Mrs. Bush speak.

During the convocation, Mrs. Bush helped the College honor S of O student Rachel Snyder and C of O student Jesse Lochman for their winning letters to a teacher who most influenced their lives. Alumnus and Board of Trustees member Mrs. Sharon Bradley was also recognized for her lifelong dedication as an educator by the College and Mrs. Bush. While reminiscing about her family, time in the White House, and her first experiences teaching at an urban school in Dallas, Mrs. Bush captivated the audience with grace, wit, and a full measure of wisdom. These are just a few examples of special days from the fall semester, and we expect the future to hold many more. Former First Lady Visits “Hard Work U.”

Former First Lady of the United States Laura Bush visited *Hard Work U.* to speak at the Leonard B. and Edith Gittinger Community Convocation themed “Education Matters” on November 8, 2012. The convocation was part of the College of the Ozarks Keeter Center for Character Education’s Community Convocation Series, which welcomes renowned leaders to share with students and the community on topics of character. Mrs. Bush arrived early that day, participating in the dedication of the School of the Ozarks and the Roy F. Hopper Patriots Plaza.

During her speech at the convocation, she informed the audience about her life and encouraged every person with her passion for education. Prior to her role as the President’s wife, Mrs. Bush was a teacher and librarian at inner-city schools in Texas. She taught at a place where children barely had enough to eat and most had not experienced a proper education. Poverty and broken homes had an extremely negative effect on the children that attended school during Mrs. Bush’s time as a teacher. Her

experiences inspired and shaped her vision for this country’s needs in education. “Reading is not just a cause I selected as a First Lady,” said Mrs. Bush, “but one of the guiding passions in my life.” Mrs. Bush was a key advocate of the President’s historic education reform—No Child Left Behind Act. This program became her platform to influence the lives of children all over the world.

Serving in the White House for eight consecutive years, Mrs. Bush experienced numerous trials. The most difficult trial of their presidency was 9/11. The former President and Mrs. Bush

were unharmed and their family safe, but the citizens of America were under different conditions during this catastrophic event. “All we could think about was the thousands of Americans who couldn’t say the same about their own loved ones,” said Bush. “And about the duty that had suddenly fallen on George to lead the country through the dark shadow that had fallen over it.” Blindsided by this destructive day of terrorism, Mrs. Bush never imagined such an event occurring during their presidency. She discussed her fears and the responsibilities during the aftermath of 9/11, and although this day was one of the most difficult trials during the Bush presidency, it was a time where America came together. “The greatest honor of being First Lady was having the chance to witness every now and then not just my husband but all of America facing up to fear and shattering change and standing proud,” said Bush. After 9/11, Mrs. Bush realized the need for education and equality was not localized to America, but all over the world.

Mrs. Bush has visited schools and met with students in nations from Afghanistan to Zambia, with a particular focus on encouraging

girls and women to pursue their education. In 2001, she became the first First Lady to give the President's weekly radio address, speaking out against the Taliban's oppression of women and children. "As First Lady I was no longer speaking out about literacy," said Mrs. Bush. "I was giving radio addresses denouncing the brutal treatment of women and children by the Taliban." She has traveled to Afghanistan three times and served as honorary chair of the U.S.-Afghan Women's Council. Also, Mrs. Bush has helped thousands of women take charge of their health by raising awareness of breast cancer and heart disease. As Ambassador for the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institutes Heart Truth campaign, Mrs. Bush traveled the country to educate women about the symptoms of heart disease, which is the number one killer of American women. John Adams once said, "There are two types of education...One should teach us how to make a living and the other how to live." Mrs. Bush has shaped her vision for education around this statement because she believes that literacy is

an essential foundation for democracy. The people of America and around the world must be educated in literacy, so they can contribute to society, making the world a better place.

Mrs. Bush has dedicated her life to empowering others with education. "When I was younger I used to think that work was what you had to do to live," said Bush. "Now I know work is what truly makes life fulfilling." College of the Ozarks exemplifies hard work and has provided an excellent education by providing a four-year liberal arts degree to deserving students who are willing to work for their education. "College of the Ozarks students receive an extraordinary education, rooted in a strong tradition of scholarship and service," said Mrs. Bush.

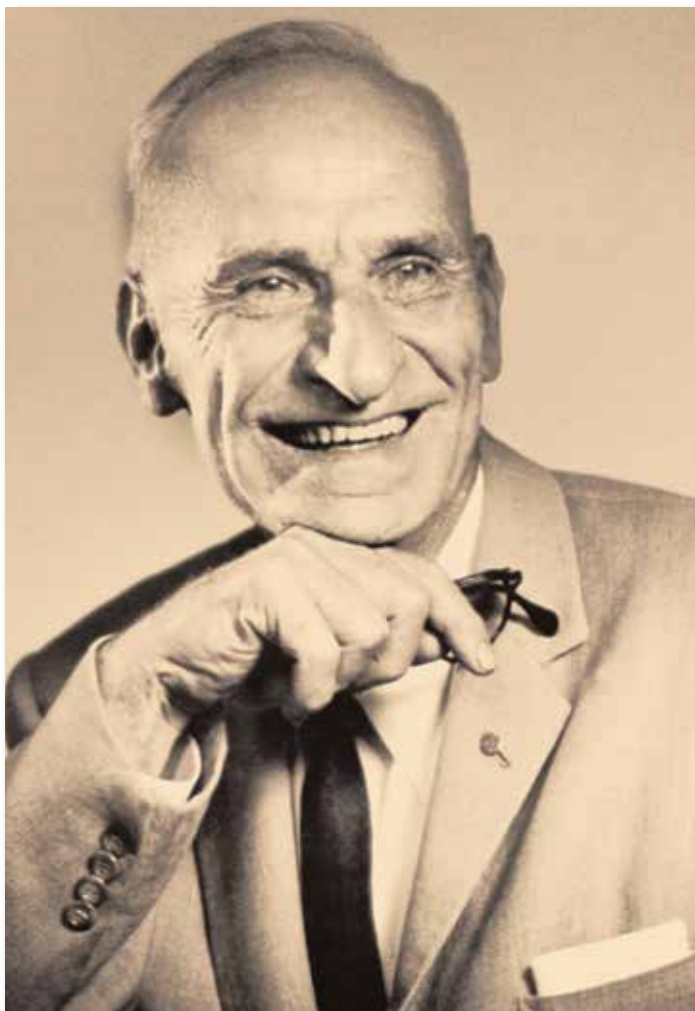

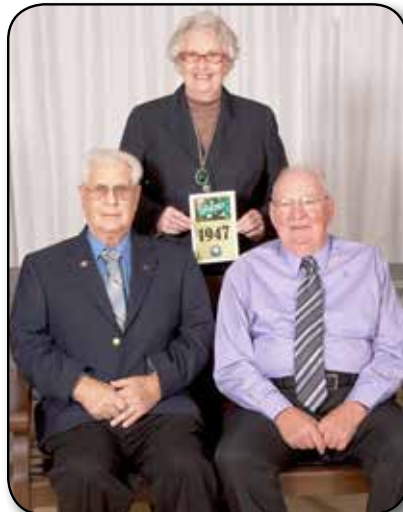

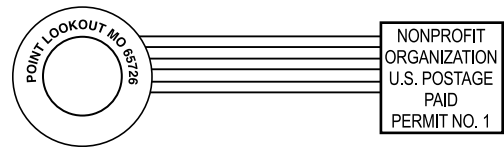

FOUR INDIVIDUALS HONORED AT TWENTY-NINTH SPORTS HALL OF FAME

College of the Ozarks honored S of O alumnus Glen Gaines and C of O alumna Cindy Russell Rear, former Track and Cross Country Coach Robert Osburn, as well as the late Colonel Gary Herchenroeder at the Twenty-Ninth Annual College of the Ozarks Sports Hall of Fame Induction Luncheon on February 9.

Sports Hall of Fame Honoree Glen Gaines started for The School of the Ozarks High School Basketball Team from 1954 to 1957. After graduating from S of O, Gaines took a year off before returning to S of O Junior College in 1958. At that time he enjoyed his positions as a starter for the junior college basketball team, catcher on the baseball team, and sprinter on the track team. Gaines participated in the dorm council, worked with the fire department, and served as class officer.



Honoree Cindy Russell Rear played volleyball from 1993 to 1996, after transferring to College of the Ozarks from Southwest Baptist University. During her career she received many honors: The Hustle Award, Mazzio's All-Conference, Rockhurst All-Tournament, First Team All-Conference, and NAIA Midwest Region All-Regional team. A member of the 20 Kill Club, Russell accomplished 20 kills against Ouachita Baptist University her senior year.



The College also inducted posthumously Associate Professor of Military Science Colonel Gary Herchenroeder, a long-time employee and avid Bobcat Athletics supporter, into its Sports Hall of Fame. Herchenroeder served as the chair of the Athletic Committee for many years. A retired Army Black Hawk helicopter pilot, he served in Operation Desert Storm, as well as the Army National Guard. Colonel Herchenroeder is remembered for piloting the much-loved Bobcat Blimp at home athletic events and during the NAIA National Tournament.

The College honored Coach Robert Osburn at the Luncheon and announced that the track would be officially named the Coach Robert Osburn Track. Coach Osburn came to The School of the Ozarks in 1957, after serving in the United States Air Force during World War II. He coached track and cross country, after earning his Bachelor of Science from Northwest Missouri State University and Master of Education from University of Missouri. Osburn was named Coach of the Year twice and earned the distinction of being named District 16 Coach of the Year at least nine times in his career. While under his leadership, the Track and Cross Country Team won 25 conference championships and seven district championships. He also coached Jesse Beard, a qualifier of the United States Olympic Trials in track and field.
