On the weekend of March 8 & 9 a group of piano students from the studio of Dr. Dwayne Huff took a field trip to Memphis, Tennessee. While in Memphis, they visited the famed Beale Street, birthplace of the Blues and frequent destination of pop music greats like Elvis Presley. But the featured event of the trip was hearing the Memphis Symphony Orchestra with guest pianist, Joyce Yang. Ms. Yang was a medalist in the 2005 Van Cliburn International Piano Competition, arguably the most

prestigious piano festival. Following the concert, the C of O group happened to meet Ms. Yang in the hall. She was very gracious to take pictures with the group and even asked for a critique of her performance! It was truly an inspiring and memorable trip.
