Congratulations! Three Voice Students Honored at NATS Competition

Vocal students from the studio of Associate Professor, Lynda Jesse, participated in the Springfield area NATS competition at Evangel University on Tuesday, October 15. NATS, The National Association of Teachers of Singing, Inc., was founded in 1944 and is now the largest association of teachers of singing in the world. Today, NATS boasts more than 6,500 members in the U.S., Canada and in over 25 other countries around the world. It also offers a variety of lifelong learning experiences to its members such as workshops, intern programs, master classes, and offers competitions for students at the local, state, regional and national levels.

The vocalists from the

College of the Ozarks competed with other singers from MSU, Drury, Evangel and SBU. Each singer per-

formed three selections which include an art song in a foreign language, an opera or oratorio aria and a 20th century piece by an American or British composer. Betsy Wilson competed in the Freshman women's division, Josiah

Fulk competed in the Freshman men's division, and Sophomores Stephanie Fitzgerald, Leslie Fredendall, and Dominique Bennett competed in their respective divisions. The students were accompanied by student accompanists Grant Allen and Amanda Brinkmann and by staff accompanist, Margaret Erickson.

The singers were judged by faculty members from the combined colleges and one winner and one runner-up was selected from each division. Josiah Fulk and Stephanie Fitzgerald were selected as runners-up in their divisions, and Leslie Fredendall tied for 1st place in her division. The 1st place winners received a cash award and performed in the Honor's Recital at the conclusion of the evening's events.

The College of the Ozarks music department is proud to have two new staff members this year. Mrs. Jill Woodhouse, strings instructor, and Mr. Robert Smither, brass instructor are both contributing greatly to our instrumental music program here at C of O.



Jill Woodhouse earned her Bachelor's degree in

violin performance from Missouri State University in 2006, and was awarded a Graduate Assistantship to continue her studies. She served as concertmaster of the Missouri State Symphony and Chamber Orchestra for five years, and is in her sixth season as a member of the first violin section in the Springfield Symphony Orchestra. She has performed with many groups such as the St. Louis Symphony Youth

Orchestra, the Chamber Orchestra of the Ozarks, the Fort Smith Symphony, the Camelo String Quartet, and for several productions with the Springfield Regional Opera and Springfield Little Theatre. She has been a teacher with the Play His Praises Home School Orchestra for four years. In the summer of 2005, Jill attended the Starling-DeLay Symposium on Violin Studies at the Juilliard School in New York City. In May 2008, Jill received her Master of Music degree in violin performance from Missouri State University. She enjoys performing, baking, and spending time with her husband.

Bob Smither is a 1982 graduate of College of the Ozarks, where he obtained his Bachelor's degree in trumpet performance. After he finished here, he attended the University of Oklahoma and received his Master of Musi-

cal Arts in Performance. From there, he went on to join the US Military Academy Band at

West Point, NY. He spent 23 1/2 years performing with the band, during which time he was privileged to play for four



different presidents, and numerous celebrities. On March 1st, 2008 he retired with the rank of Sergeant Major. Mr. Smither has performed in many orchestras and ensembles through the years, including the Springfield Symphony Orchestra, the Oklahoma City Symphony, and the Hudson Valley Philharmonic. In his experience, performing for presidents, heads of state, celebrities, ad other notable Americans, Mr. Smither says that he has felt most honored to perform TAPS for hundreds of fallen veterans over the years.

Carnegie Hall, as well as Kennedy Center, and now has a new CD, Viva Flamenco!, that is available worldwide.

Radford will be giving a lecture and demonstration on Wednesday, November 12 at 4:00 p.m. in the Newman Recital Hall, as well as a full concert at 7:30 p.m. in the Royal Oak Auditorium at the Keeter Center.


