

FAFSA Time!!!

It is time to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the 2012-2013 academic year. As you are aware, College of the Ozarks requires all students to complete the FAFSA or Renewal FAFSA each year, with the exception of May 2012 graduates, International students, and faculty/staff dependents. This year the deadline is March 5th, 2012.

~February 1st – 20th~Students and parents should complete Federal Income taxes. This allows you 10 days later, if taxes are filed electronically, to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool within the FAFSA to pull your tax information.

~March 1st- 5th~ Submit FAFSA 10 days later between using the IRS Data Retrieval tool as well as signing the FAFSA with parent and student PINs.

The FAFSA requires 2011 tax information. If you or your parents have not yet filed your 2011 taxes, you should use tax estimates to complete the FAFSA. Once you have filed your 2011 taxes, you will then be able to correct and update your FAFSA 10 days later if filing electronically using the IRS Data Retrieval tool.

Starting with the 2012-2013 award year, students and parents who opt not to use the IRS Data Retrieval process and who subsequently are selected by the Department of Education for verification, will be required to obtain the tax information — tax transcripts — directly from the IRS. This could lead to long delays in processing. Because we will not know ahead of time who will and who will not be selected for verification, we strongly recommend that you use the IRS Data Retrieval Process when you complete your FAFSA or when correcting the FAFSA. The retrieval process is available 2-3 weeks after you have electronically filed your federal taxes.

Any portion of grants and scholarships (academic, athletic, Bonner, ROTC, etc.) which pays for room and board is taxable. In addition, for students who worked on campus during the summer to pay for the coming year's room and board, the value of that room and board (\$5,600 for 2011, plus \$2,100 for room and board during the 12-week summer term = \$7,700 total for room and board during the 12-week Summer term) is taxable because such work is considered an educational scholarship, and should be included as a taxable scholarship on the student's tax form. Education loans are considered to be neither a grant nor a scholarship, and are not taxable. If you are unsure if you need to file taxes please check with a tax professional or www.irs.gov.

If you file taxable scholarships on your federal tax return you will also need to put it under question 43 d. of the FAFSA Additional Financial Information – Taxable student grant and scholarship aid reported to the IRS in your Adjusted Gross Income.

*Note: The FAFSA on the Web application must be submitted by our deadline of March 5, 2012. Failure to complete the FAFSA and submit additional documentation when asked will cancel registration for the next term at College of the Ozarks and could delay your application for scholarships such as the Summer Work Program, C of O Book, L.W. Hyer Book and other C of O Scholarships.
