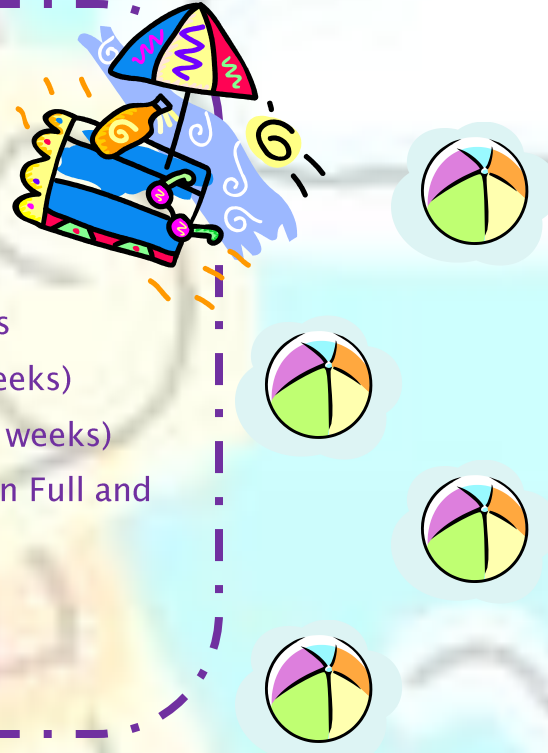

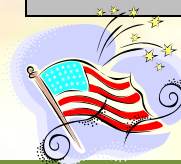
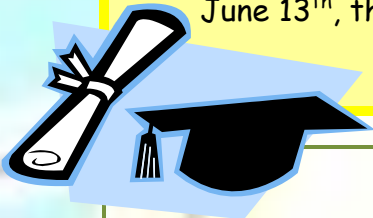

Each graduating student will receive four reserved tickets for downstairs seating. Upstairs seating is available to additional guests on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Graduates can pick up diplomas June 6th- June 10th in the Dean of the College Office if the student's account is free of any financial obligations. Starting June 13th, the diplomas will be mailed to the graduates.

Honor America

Honor America is a community-wide event that will be held on June 26th this year. It is an event to celebrate Independence Day and includes events for children, entertainment by Branson entertainers and concludes with a larger-than-life fireworks show. This event is free to the public and will be held on the lawn by Lake Honor.



Probation/Suspension Information

After reviewing the final grades from this semester, if a student's grades are below satisfactory academic progress, (2.0 cumulative GPA or 1.6 semester GPA) the student will be placed on academic probation for the Fall 2011 semester. If placed on probation, the student will only be allowed to take a maximum of 15 hours during the Fall semester. Also, they will be required to take Learning Strategies (IDS 021) for 1 credit hour if it has not been taken previously. These changes may be made in the Registrar's office between 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, the first week of the semester.

In addition, students on probation may not participate in auditioned theatre roles, student government, intercollegiate athletics, extra-curricular college trips, auditioned ensembles, and other programs and scholarships that have grade point requirements. It is strongly advised that students on probation terminate any off-campus employment. If the student does not bring up their cumulative grade point average to a 2.0 minimum by the end of the fall semester, he/she will face suspension from College of the Ozarks. A student who is suspended for academic reasons will be eligible to apply for re-admission to the college after one semester.
