The six WWII Veterans whose stories are included are Andy Anderson (5th Engineers Special Brigade), Bill Kamsler (102nd Infantry Division), Ned Knapp (75th Infantry Division), John Primerano (101st Airborne), Lou Rabesa (Army Air Force), and Bryan Sperry (75th Infantry Division).

Cailin will be signing her books at the Keeter Center on May 12th from 1:00-3:00p.m. All proceeds from the book are being donated by Cailin to the College's Patriotic Education Travel Program. Fans can also start looking forward to another book that she will begin writing this summer, as one of the Veterans that she accompanied, John Primerano, has asked her to write his personal memoir.

Summer Renter Meal Options

Students at CofO have the option of renting a room on campus if they are not working the summer work program. Although the cost of their room does not include meals in the cafeteria, the Pearl Dining Center has several meal options available to students renting during the summer. One option includes purchasing a set number of meals (ranging from 30 to 84). Students may also pay \$45 for a 10 meal punch card. Additionally, students may simply pay the meal price at the door, prices range from \$4 for breakfast to \$6 for dinner. Academic Probation & Suspension Information

After reviewing the final grades from this semester, if a student's grades are below satisfactory academic progress, (cumulative 1.8 GPA for students with 30 or fewer attempted hours, or cumulative 2.0 GPA for those with 31 or more attempted hours) the student will be placed on academic probation for the Fall 2012 semester. If placed on probation, students are encouraged to take a reduced course load, enroll in Learning Strategies, and should consider re-taking courses with a C- or below to raise their GPA.

In addition, students on probation may not participate in extracurricular college activities. It is strongly advised to terminate any off-campus employment. If the student does not show satisfactory academic progress, he/she will face suspension from College of the Ozarks. A student who is suspended for academic reasons will be eligible to apply for re-admission to the college after one semester. Confidentiality

College of the Ozarks complies with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974. In accordance with the federal law, the College has adopted policies and procedures governing the confidentiality of student educational records. In general, no individual shall have access to, nor will the College disclose any information from, a student's education record without the written consent of the student. Exceptions allow certain personnel of the College to see records as well as procedures for release in emergency situations.
